
Michael Grilli

A self-described "Framingham-ite," Michael Grilli moved here from Worcester in 1969, and it didn't take long before his impact was felt in making the town a better place to live. By the late 1970s, Michael was named to the Permanent Building Committee, where his expertise as a civil engineer was tapped and he helped oversee several major projects, such as the design and construction of the main library located in the downtown area. It wasn't long before Michael was named Chair of the committee, where he spearheaded numerous improvements — from schools, to police stations, and Loring Arena, among others. Those who nominated him as a Salute honoree point out that, "In addition to volunteering time, Michael often used the donated resources of his own company, Beta Engineering, and would regularly spend out-of-pocket money to keep Framingham's capital projects moving forward." Over the last 40-plus years, Michael, who enjoys golfing in his spare time, has come to appreciate all the town has to offer. "I'm definitely vested in the community," he said. "I'm very impressed with the level of services provided to the community and I believe they continue undiminished."



Joey Sementelli

At a young age, Joey Sementelli has already made a huge splash. His work as a swimming coach and mentor has positively affected the lives of many in town. One recent example came when he took over the Framingham recreation summer swim team — the same team in which he was a member for many years — and grew its membership from 80 to more than 200. Asked about his role in that growth, Joey said, "The goal all along, and it's not just my goal, is to get kids involved because it's fun and healthy. It's just a great activity to be part of." Those who nominated him as a Salute honoree cite his passion for swimming and "unique ability to develop meaningful, positive, and productive relationships with children, parents, volunteers and members of the community." Joey was a standout swimmer at Framingham High who graduated from the University of Maryland, Baltimore County in 2008. He is now working toward a master's degree in sports administration from Nichols College, and said he feels fortunate to have grown up in Framingham. "I had a lot of people who were good role models and mentors," he said. "They taught me about the importance of being involved in the community." Now he's passing that on to others.



Karin's main job is to ensure that students who are struggling in school socially or emotionally have the proper supports to be able to succeed. Karin goes "above and beyond" the job description every day. She has an outstanding work ethic and does whatever it takes to keep the school running smoothly. She works to coordinate services within the school to provide all of our students with the best possible starts to their formal education. She also works very closely with outside agencies to support families in providing the necessities for their children so that they come to school each day ready to learn.

In addition to being Potter Road's 504 Coordinator, Karin is also a member of the Potter Road School Council, and our Student Support Team. She is bilingual, fluent in both English and Portuguese, and serves as a translator and a district wide tutor. ABBY ANDERSON - has been a custodian for the Framingham Public School for the past 22 years, most of these years at Walsh Middle School. During this time, he has assisted many teachers with any possible classroom dilemma imaginable. In doing so, he always shows patience and kindness as well as a wonderful sense of humor. There are many challenges during a "normal" school week such as jammed lockers, keeping up with the cafeteria, juggling and assisting two gyms filled with a Shakespeare festival, or a Special Olympics event with over 500 people. He meets each challenge with excellence and tremendous pride in his work.

Abby also serves as a fantastic example to our students. He is one of the heroes among us at Walsh and every morning he greets the teachers, students and parents by proudly raising our American flag. Abby is a Unites States Marine, Veteran of the Vietnam War and a Purple Heart recipient. For over two decades he has been a member of the Framingham Veterans Council. Along with other veterans, Abby leads the group as Officer of the Day, actively participating in the ceremonies on Memorial and Veterans Day. At the annual Walsh Veterans Day tribute, Abby is an important contributor to the day's events. He shares his Vietnam experiences with students of the 6th grade class and teaches them invaluable lessons.

On a daily basis, students are able to experience and value this amazing and hardworking individual who is worthy of tremendous respect. He is one who has proudly served his country and continues to contribute to his home town community.

JOE ANTONIOLI - was born and raised in Framingham. He not only attended both North and South High Schools, but they were also where he spent thirty-four years as a math teacher, coach and athletic director. During his time at Framingham, Joe was also an integral member of the Framingham Teachers Association. To commemorate his tireless and impressive service to the Framingham Public Schools, he was insistent that he host his own retirement celebration. After treating everyone to a great meal at Framingham's own Hometown Hotdogs, Joe provided a witty commentary, memorable advice from his many years of teaching and personally addressed each member of the math department.

Instead of retreating to a warm climate or playing golf multiple times a week, he has spent a great deal of his retirement time back at Framingham High School. Joe spends countless hours tutoring students in math and most specifically helping struggling students prepare to take their MCAS tests. In addition, whenever a teacher is absent, he can be counted on to keep the math classes running smoothly and goes out of his way to help out all teachers. Joe's helping hand has been and continues to be felt by so many. It is hard to know where Joe's influence stops since he continues to make such a positive impact on the faculty and students at Framingham High School. Joe Antonioli... You Are Special!

NANCY BORGHESE'S - caring and quiet efforts have impacted the lives of many in the Framingham community. As Dunning Elementary School's nurse and a foster parent, she has provided a safe haven for many children. Over the last 26 years, she has opened her home to 65 foster children. In the early years, while raising her biological son and daughter, she and her family took in young boys and girls, many of whom were siblings. As her children grew and left home, she welcomed, primarily, adolescent boys. In fact, today, the Borghese's are the only family in the area who open their home to adolescent boys.

Many of the young men who lived in Nancy's home during the past five years, have chosen to stay in touch especially around the holidays. Upon graduating from high school, the boys have pursued employment, college and the military, including the US Naval Academy. At this time, Nancy is providing a home and support to four young men; three are Framingham High School students.

Nancy's dedication, strong commitment, persistence, and educational advocacy on behalf of these children strengthen the foundation for their future successes. Nancy Borghese...You Are Special!



ANNE BLAKE - has taught a class for students with multiple handicaps at Barbieri for many years. She works tirelessly to teach her students the skills many of us take for granted; walking, talking, feeding ourselves and communicating with others, along with basic reading, math, science and social studies. Anne sees the potential in each individual and helps guide them, their parents and their families through the often challenging waters of learning and of raising a multiply handicapped child.

Anne's day begins with greeting her children and helping them out of their special buses or vans. Her work is physical as well as mental as she must often lift them from their wheelchairs onto equipment which can assist them in standing and walking. She must be very creative in finding ways to deliver content and self-help curriculum to the children in a way they will understand. The special portfolios they must produce to meet MCAS criteria take weeks to create and organize and Anne must begin the planning in September for a Spring deadline. All her students have received passing grades on their assessments!

Anne is a tireless advocate for her students and their families; often working with our social worker and guidance counselor to be sure they are receiving all the services and therapies they need. She also advocates for essential equipment for her students. Recently, she and other specialists collaborated on a write-up advocating for handicap accessible housing for a student so the student could use a wheelchair. She works closely with school therapists, speech and language, occupational and physical to include their recommendations into her daily classroom routine. Anne is always looking for ways her students can have experience with typical students.

She arranges reverse integration where students from other classes come to her room to interact and assist her students. They always end up learning as much from Anne's students as Anne's students learn from them! In addition, Anne has been the building representative for the Framingham Teachers' Association advocating for her colleagues and has served as mentor to new special education teachers for many years. We at Barbieri are fortunate to have Anne Blake on our team! Anne Blake... You Are Special!

SUSAN CORCORAN - started her career first as a student teacher and then as a history teacher at FHS in 2004. Within the History Department she is known as the guru of Modern World History. She takes pride in her ability to mold her students and to push as many as she can into AP US History by using primary sources and document based questions, the format that AP students have to use their sophomore year.

She has been instrumental in starting the Making It Happen program which identifies, nurtures, and supports low income and minority students with a goal of Advanced Placement Level work at the high school. Susan does this during the summer each year. Whether it is her honors or her cp-1 classes, students can always be seen having fun while also learning vigorously. Susan also trains students in Model UN, taking them on a weekend trip to compete in the Model UN competition.

In addition, she organizes the Holiday Drive in her role as Honor Society advisor, mentors a student through the Step up to Excellence program, and is one of this year's Senior Class advisors. Susan Corcoran... You Are Special!

BARBARA FINE - is the special magical teacher we love to have in our schools. As an eighth grade Social Studies teacher, she makes complex learning tasks reachable for all students from all backgrounds. Her commitment to the teaching profession signals her deep care and devotion to her students. Mrs. Fine qualities extend beyond the classroom. She is a team leader, leads professional development activities, is the Student Council coordinator, is a workshop presenter, and a leader in content literacy. A teacher leader indeed, Barbara Fine... You Are Special!

MELANIE GODDARD - As the Fuller Technology Specialist, Melanie has single-handedly kept our school's technology fully functional, even in these difficult economic times. She stays at work well beyond her regular day to make sure our students and teachers get the technology support that they need. She does this with great enthusiasm and with great pride. She regularly participates in school events and activities.

Melanie is resourceful and is always looking for a "good deal" in securing equipment for our school. She will work through summers and vacations to do whatever it takes to get the job done. Melanie has certainly contributed in so many ways to the betterment of our school and we certainly feel that Melanie Goddard... You Are Special!

BETH HERRMANN - We have had the honor of having Beth as a teacher at Walsh for the past ten years. Not only is she an amazing teacher, but she is also involved in many facets of the school; that it's hard to list them all.

Primarily, Beth is a special education teacher for students in our learning center program. She teaches English Language Arts for the 7th and 8th grade. Beth also teaches Wilson Reading. Her dedication to the students is astounding. She does an amazing job generating creative lessons that keep her students engaged and challenged, while still promoting a sense of confidence and success. Beth goes above and beyond all our expectations. She always has the students' best interest in mind. Most times, Beth is with students in groups reading The Outsiders or coaching students individually on how they can improve and make good choices. She makes the learning "real" and "practical" for her students.

She is a strong advocate for her students and will do anything for them. They all rely on her greatly and it doesn't hurt that they all think she is "cool" too. We asked some students, "What makes Mrs. Herrmann special?" They answered, "She believes in me." "Mrs. Herrmann is fair." "She makes reading fun, even though I don't like it much."

Beth has coached track at Walsh for many years. She takes the students to the Boston Athletic Association Relay Races every April before the marathon to compete with other middle schools. The students have a fantastic time and get to meet professional Olympic marathon runners as well as experience running to the finish line of the Boston Marathon.

BETH HERRMANN(cont.) - Beth is also a Mazie Mentor. She works with a former Walsh student. Beth has been an amazing mentor to this young lady and has taken her on college tours and community service events. Beth serves on many committees for Walsh and the district. She was a member of the Middle School Literacy Committee last year, and also serves as a PTO and School Council teacher representative. Beth has been a team leader for the past two years, and organizes the annual Walsh 5k road race that raises money for various local charities.

Amazingly, Beth is extremely humble. She never seeks attention for her accomplishments and often seems surprised when praised. Simply put, Beth is remarkable! She is easily one of the best educators we have ever come across. For all of these achievements, Beth Herrmann... You Are Special!

MARIE JUTKIEWICZ - or MRS. J. as she is affectionately called is a wonderful, kind and patient teacher who is great with students and with parents. She is generous, kind-spirited, loves each and every one of her students and finds different ways to help each child learn. She goes above and beyond to help her students reach their full potential.

She can never do enough to help her students, their parents and her school. She attends every PTO meeting and volunteers for every event. Ms. I is always surrounded by students hugging her. She encourages the sense of curiosity in her students by developing their tolerance of others and appreciation of different cultures. She helps the children grow with strong ethics and a lifelong love of learning. Marie Jutkiewicz ... You Are Special!

AMY KARIDOYANES - is one of our beloved resource teachers in the seventh grade. Amy is considered a Teacher Leader among our staff due to her exceptional professional skills. She has led study groups, is a workshop presenter, is a Team Leader, and a mentor teacher. She stays at work well beyond the regular day to support students and to provide academic diversity in all of her classes. Amy takes the lead when anything needs to be done. She sets the trend for others to follow. This is done in a very humble, respectful and professional manner. Amy is involved in all aspects of school life, frequently volunteering in school events or when a job needed to be done. We know she cares! A teacher leader among leaders, Amy Karidoyanes... MARGOT LAFORTUNE FLIONIS - is an amazing social worker at Cameron Middle School. She spends hours nurturing students, conversing with them, and making them successful in school. She works with some of our most endearing but challenging students. She is empathetic and caring. Her job description has no limits. She is in touch with many outside agencies to help families in need and sees some students on an on-going basis to ensure they are successful in school. She runs lunch groups, communication groups, and bereavement groups. Her "Loss of a Loved One" group is well known among the students and staff at Cameron Middle School. Those students who have endured the loss of a parent or sibling may join this special counseling group which offers them an opportunity to discuss their feelings and support one another. She also runs classroom discussions on bullying and wellness.

She is a caring person who dresses up each year in a different costume to run the arts and crafts room for Halloween Haven, the school's community service project each October. She has been a class advisor, she oversees the jogging club after school, takes students to Boston on a weekend for the BAA competition, and she helps out at the annual Spaghetti Dinner for all the families and students. Margot plays in the student versus staff basketball game and is a major participant in all things having to do with student mental health and wellness. This year she secured bullying books for the teachers to use in small group reading groups and brought Brigitte Berman to the school for the entire student body to hear and meet. Brigitte is the 16 year old author of a bullying book, Dorie Witt's Guide to Surviving Bullying.

When a student was recently asked if he remembered Margot's name, he referred to her as "Mrs. Sunshine" because he pointed out that she is always upbeat and happy. Margot scurries from one appointment to the next with a smile. Students wait for her in the morning to be greeted and start their day while others run up to her when report cards come out to flaunt their good grades. Her enthusiasm and support of all Cameron students is electrifying and contagious. All in all, Margot is hard working, caring, and a real gem. Margot LaFortune Flionis... You Are Special!

KATH REILLY'S - career at Brophy began when Tom Foley the principal at Brophy drove to her home and asked her to come to work for him. He knew her background in Special Ed and kindergarten in addition to her many moves (she had taught at all of Framingham's elementary schools except Woodrow) gave her experience as an excellent teacher who was extremely flexible.

At Brophy Kath has taken on strong leadership roles—as a teacher of kindergarten then third grade, as the co-founder of the award winning "Kids Who Care" community service program and in her biggest, most challenging role as E.L.T. coordinator. With little precedent to rely on as models, she led the staff in planning and implementing an 8 hour day for our students and staff.

As that leader she needed to satisfy a constituency of teachers, parents, administration, and students. Certainly not an easy task, but a challenge that Kath stood up to meet, requiring her to be positive, engaging, intelligent, diplomatic, and, of course, flexible. When the program ended, Kath quietly made some personal sacrifices to help colleagues. She continues to be a dedicated member of the Brophy staff working in leadership roles, as an advocate for children, and as a resource for staff. Kath Reilly... You Are Special!

LAURA SLASON - is completing her 12th year at Fuller Middle School as the Attendance Secretary in the office. Laura deals with everyone, students, staff, and parents in an upbeat and positive manner. Laura knows the name of every student at Fuller and has the ability to relate to each of them in a personal, calm, and caring way, making them feel comfortable in any situation. They shower her with signs, such as "We love you, Mrs. Slason, and Mrs. Slason you are the best." She is a tireless worker going above and beyond, also volunteering at evening events, yet never asking for anything in return. Despite the demands of a hectic office, she managed to expertly learn and navigate the new software X2 program. She is steady and humble, a cherished, and respected member of the Fuller community. For all of these reasons and so many more, Laura Slason... You Are Special!

SUSAN STOTZKY - has been in the field of education for nearly 30 years, 25 of those here in Framingham. She has worked with special education students with a range of needs and in a variety of settings, including substantially separate classrooms, inclusion settings, and the Resource Room model. She has worked with students from many grade levels, in multiple buildings, and even served as a Team Chairperson for a number of years before moving to her current position at Charlotte A. Dunning Elementary School. Susan has also served as "head teacher" here at Dunning for many years, and she thrives in this position.

In all that she does, Susan exudes professionalism, enthusiasm, a sense of humor, and most importantly, a true advocacy for all of her students. 




