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


In his 39-year career as part of the Framingham school system, Arthur Del Prete says he enjoyed every day. He knew he wanted to be a teacher as early as the seventh grade. During his tenure in that director's role, he oversaw the merger of Framingham South and Framingham North in 1991, which was a monumental task that reorganized the school system. George Hulme



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

First and foremost, his enthusiastic and creative teaching style led him to implement the single-most popular elective in the school: American Pop Culture. This class repeatedly has more students sign-up than can be accommodated because it is fun and enlightening. He has also been instrumental in creating the Peer Leadership program at FHS. This program operates in conjunction with the Anti-Defamation League to recruit upper class students to train and implement anti-bullying workshops with underclassmen. As founder and director of the program, Mr. Convery is responsible for recruiting, interviewing and training students for their roles as facilitators in classes. This program has created a perceptible improvement in the climate of the school.

As a class advisor he is instrumental in organizing fund-raising activities that more often the not become fun activities. For example, he organized a harbor cruise for his 500-member ninth grade class, something that had never been done before. In addition, Jeff also manages the Saturday School program, organizes the faculty and ensures that students get work done when assigned. JENNIFER EISENBERG - is not just the literacy specialist at Cameron Middle School. She works tirelessly with all staff members to improve student literacy across all grades and in all content areas. She is a remarkable educator and a caring and generous individual. She is the go-to person when people need advice, or when we are giving an assessment, reviewing data or planning a parent portfolio day. She is a friend to everyone and "no' is not part of her vocabulary. She understands the needs of the middle school student and works diligently to assist all children to reach their potential. Her extraordinary abilities provide professional development for teachers, which include co-teaching units on reading and literacy, implementing the teaching and assessment of key vocabulary words, doing small group instruction, running reading contests, holding literacy meetings in the early morning hours, overseeing a seventh grade data team and overall going above and beyond her job description!

She has initiated a reading contest where students are excited about reading and reporting on outside novels. Those who read the most are treated to a field trip to a local college. They are introduced to college life, classrooms, professors, students, and sports that help them set future goals. Her love of reading and writing as well as her ability to share this love with others has been contagious among students and staff alike. JULIE GORMAN - has dedicated the past thirty-four years to educating the students in Framingham and thirty of the years at Walsh Middle School. As she completes her thirty-fifth year in June 2010 with plans to retire, we will have to say goodbye to a truly dynamic and wonderful teacher.

Julie's expertise is extremely broad. She has taught at many different levels; remedial reading, reader's workshop for students in SAGE, literacy for struggling readers, and sixth through eighth grade language arts. She served as the English Language Arts department head for many years and is currently a Literacy Specialist. Julie is also a trained mentor for the Framingham District and has been an amazing support to new teachers who are seeking ways to improve their teaching skills. She facilities grade level curriculum meetings for grades six through eight and also runs our annual Peter Gray essay contest for eighth grade students. She has contributed to the department of education in scoring as well as developing topics for MCAS tests. These are only some examples of what Julie has accomplished in her teaching career.

Words cannot describe the impact Julie has made on the thousands of students she has helped and guided throughout her career. She makes learning fun, and all of her students would attest to that as she takes a genuine and personal interest in the "whole" student. Some of the fond nicknames from her students are, "Miss" and "Gramma G". She takes a special interest with our most at-risk students and encourages them to do their best and to believe in themselves. As one colleague stated, "Julie is just as energized, excited, and interested in teaching and educating students and staff as when she walked through the doors thirty-five years ago."

We have all learned from Julie and she has made all of us around her a better person and teacher. Julie, we will miss you and "You Are Special!"

KRISTEN KELLEY - begins each morning greeting a group of 30 students who aren't sure they want to be in school at all. These kids are part of a highly specialized program that works with students in serious academic peril. Ms. Kelley's tenure at Framingham High School began 10 years ago when she was hired fresh out of Assumption College to teach Spanish in the World Languages Department. Five years later she filled a need to work with more troubled kids by joining the Resiliency for Life program as the Coordinator for the 9th and 11th grade sections.

Along the way, Ms. Kelley earned honorable mention as Framingham High School "Teacher of the Year" award in 2003 and 2004. More recently, Ms. Kelley successfully completed her master's degree in education. Ms. Kelley has earned the reputation as being a talented and challenging teacher, a teacher who, above all else, is called to advocate for the kid who needs a second chance to do better. Without her deep commitment to their academic success, many of the students Ms. Kelley works with would not have graduated from Framingham High School, and for this we can all be deeply grateful. Brigitte's support to our families and students from Haiti during the recent tragedy has been nothing less than extraordinary. She assisted the students with emotional stability and support while they awaited word regarding family and friends, and because the students have formed such a special relationship with Mrs. Leu, they all felt comfortable and connected to share thoughts, feelings and emotions as they worked through a very trying time together.

Additionally, Mrs. Leu has been seen in the building way beyond her regularly scheduled hours, even into the evening at one point this year, to assist a family who was struggling through a difficult time.
