Also, this June culminates in my last 2 ½ years of mentoring a high school student through the Mazie Program Volunteering my time with the youth of Framingham has always been an enjoyable endeavor. "Being honored as a 2008 Salute to Framingham Award recipient came as a complete and wonderful surprise. The Mazie Mentoring Program, which pairs volunteer adult mentors with Framingham High School students recommended by school staff as at-risk of not realizing their full potential, had been in operation since 1998, accepting 30 sophomores per year into the program. Salute to Framingham's recognition of our efforts was a significant contributor to our ability to raise additional funds to increase the program's impact at the school. Starting in 2009, we increased our intake by 33% to 40/year. Since inception, over 450 Framingham youth have entered our program. 95% have graduated from high school. 44 alumni are now in college, receiving their annual \$500 scholarship installments. 79 alumni have graduated from a 2 yr. community college or 4 year university. We reached a significant milestone last year when a mentee, who became the first in her family to attend college, graduated with a Bachelors Degree and returned to the foundation to become a mentor in our program. Everyone at the John Andrew Mazie Memorial Foundation will always be grateful for Salute to Framingham's recognition of our work with Framingham youth." Lowell Mazie (2008)



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
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Sharon Gilbert

Sharon Gilbert is the owner and founder of Timothy's Toy Box, a Framingham based non-profit corporation established in 2007 to help local children in need during the holiday season. Sharon, a Framingham native and Framingham North graduate, works tirelessly throughout the year to fundraise, collect donations, and wrap and distribute the toys. "My son Timothy and I started this in 2007 in hopes that we might be able to help some of the local children in need to have toys for Christmas. Since that time our list of children has grown tremendously. Over the past 6 seasons we have provided toys and supplies to almost 1,000 children and have collected over 5,000 toys in total."

Sharon's efforts go beyond that of a typical toy drive: she works closely with the local shelters to gather wish lists for the children to ensure they receive gifts they have requested. Sharon enlists the help of family, friends, neighbors and local organizations and businesses to make sure that holiday wishes are filled. Timothy's Toy Box also provides everything families need to wrap the presents themselves (wrapping paper, tape, tags, scissors, batteries, etc.) so they can share in the joy, while respecting each family's anonymity and dignity. They also bring stuffed animals, toys and books to the Pediatric Unit at MetroWest Hospital and the Children's Hospital Cancer Center. Tony Tolson

Tony Tolson, a Framingham native, has been active in the Town of Framingham youth sports for the most of his life, first as a youth player, and for the last 10 years as coach. As part of the Framingham Youth Football League, he has served as a coach and as a member on the Board of Directors. In 2010, Tony took a team who had lost every game to closing out the season 6-3. The next year, in 2011, his team finished the season at 8-1, won the Bay State Conference, Mass State Championship (the first in Framingham history), the New England Regional Championships, and went on to compete in the National Championship in Florida! In 2012, the team was undefeated and again became Bay State Conference Champions. "In the last 3 years, I was honored to be part of something that may never happen again, but we created a lifetime of memories. " Tony also coaches youth basketball, including CYO Basketball, TBA Basketball and YMCA Basketball. His coaching style is to focus on fundamentals and theory. "There's a difference in talent and skill! God gives you talent, you perfect your skill!" Tony strongly believes in education first, sports second, and encourages each of his players to pursue a college education. When he is not coaching sports, Tony is involved in fundraising for the homeless, food pantries and shelters, as well as Breast Cancer awareness initiatives. Tony would like to thank his 3 boys, Anthony Jr., Joseph, and Michael for "putting up with him as a coach" and thanks his wife and his mother for their love and support.



We encourage everyone from Framingham to consider nominating an individual, from any sector of the community, who has made a difference in the lives of the youth of our town.


The basic criteria for this nomination are that the individual has given selflessly to the youth of Framingham. All nominations received will be kept on file and reviewed in January of each year.



2013 Jim O'Connor Community Service Award

The Jim O'Connor Community Service Award is given in honor of those who hold the passion, vision, commitment and leadership skills of the Salute to Framingham founder, Jim O'Connor. Recipients are individuals, organizations, or families who work as a team to serve the youth of Framingham.



The 2013 recipient of the Jim O'Connor Community Service Award is Samaritans, Inc. Samaritans purpose is to alleviate despair, isolation, distress and suicidal feelings among individuals in our community, 24 hours a day; to educate the public about suicide prevention; and to reduce the stigma associated with suicide. Samaritans, Inc. was established in 1974 and has had an office in Framingham delivering important services to the community since 1984.

Samaritans' volunteers come from all walks of life. While they do not necessarily share any particular prior experience or training, Samaritans share a deep respect for human life and a desire to reach out to those in pain. Samariteens is the youth peer leadership segment of the Samaritans Befriending Services. It is dedicated specifically to the prevention of suicide among teens. Started in 1986, this teen help line provides confidential peer support and understanding to teens who are struggling with feelings of depression, loneliness and stress.

Under the leadership of Samaritans Eileen Davis, Director of the Framingham Site, over 270 teenagers from Framingham High School have been trained and volunteered on Samaritans crisis lines since 1986. In 2012 alone, 18 Samariteens from Framingham High School were trained to be helpline befrienders and have provided over 1000 hours of service. Framingham High School was also the first high school in the Commonwealth to partner with Samaritans on the "IM Hear_" Teen to Teen Emotional Online Support Chat Service, an on-line instant messaging support service. Samaritans, Inc. also partners with Framingham State University, provides services to Marion HS, Keefe Tech, St Bridget's, Temple Beth Am and many other local Framingham civic groups.

Samaritans, Inc. is proud of the legacy of service we have created in Framingham: Our volunteers learn how to truly listen to others, to remain calm, to be non-judgmental, and they also learn about the challenges that others, who would normally fall well outside of their normal social circles, face on a daily basis. This gives our volunteers a new perspective and a new appreciation for those things they have and for the people in their lives.

She has also created a buzz in the building for the First in Math program creating a competition among the students for their involvement in the online program outside of school hours.

Leslie often is found in her classroom with her algebra students reviewing for an upcoming test. The students adore her and many told me that she is the best Math teacher they have ever had because she doesn't allow them to give up and is encouraging and patient. When we asked her students, past and present, to describe Mrs. Gillis in one word, they said, "patient, encouraging, cool, smart, creative, motivating, motherly, and the best brownie baker." The 4th grade Two-Way Bilingual Program Team is comprised of 4 outstanding educators, Kirstin Veeder Sheen, Ned Sawyer, Katy Shander-Reynolds and Mona Viteri-Harutunian. This teacher team has had the advantage of working together for a number of years and embodies the characteristics of a high performing team. They are committed to the goals of the Two-Way program; high levels of bilingualism and biliteracy for all their students. They set high expectations for their students and for themselves and year after year, their students experience high levels of achievement and high levels of growth. Each member of the team has an ability to make each student feel valued and students feel safe and comfortable with them. Students who have shown behavioral challenges often soften. These teachers get the best from their students! They push themselves to ask the hard questions and to constantly seek to improve their practice. When they identify a problem, they set out to find a solution.

Five years ago, the team identified a need for their students to receive a coordinated system of interventions in language arts and math. They learned about RTI and implemented the first RTI model in the school. This model became the basis for the development of grade level teacher assistance teams, which has now become the district-wide grade level intervention meetings.

Four years ago, this team saw an incoming group of students who were experiencing high levels of social-emotional difficulties. Together with school support staff, they developed a consistent positive behavior program for the grade level. Once implemented, other staff were amazed at their students' success. Two years later, their program became the foundation for our current school-wide positive behavior program called CARE.

The staff and students at Barbieri are privileged to count among its faculty such a dedicated, hard-working and effective instructional team who work to improve the lives of not only their students, but positively affect the entire school community! Bilingual Team Members – You Are Special!


